 a letter from home...

BEING IN A RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

God is close, connected, and engaged with our lives. He knows everything that is going on. He pays attention to our every tear, every joy, every concern. We pray for a longing for connection with God to take root in us, so that God is inside of us — truly at our hands, in our heads and hearts.

When we look at Scripture, we find story after story of individuals who have experienced God. These are stories for us to experience so that we can be like those people of Scripture — engaged in an ongoing relationship with God where he continually talks to us. God is inside of our head, he is at our hand, he is working with us. The disciples got to hear and touch Jesus. The more we read the Scriptures the more we understand that the experience of the people who walked and talked with Jesus is our experience. We are invited to believe and trust in the presence of Christ who is within us, working with us, speaking to us, through the most ordinary and most human experiences of our lives.

The passage from the Book of Job is a story we know pretty well: It's a story of human suffering. It's a story of disappointment, about testing a relationship with God. There's a conversation that implies that Job — a just man — is doing all the marvelous things he does for God simply because God has been so good to him. Job has wonderful crops, he has wonderful cattle, beautiful children, a lovely home, great health. Everything is working for Job. The argument with God is: "Sure, these people like you. Sure, they are your friends. Look what you are giving them. But if you didn't give these wonderful things, they wouldn't love you. They would never be close to you." God takes on the bet. Poor Job has to experience the test. What is so interesting in the story of Job is that we see his steadfastness, his capacity to hang onto the relationship even though things are not going the way he wanted them to go. This story is frightening because everything that Job loved is taken away from him. It's a story of what we are doing in our relationship with God: Are we in this relationship for what we can get? Or, are we in the relationship because we choose to be in it, because somehow we know that this is the right place to be. The fascinating aspect of the Book of Job is that we might think it would end with an image of how suffering and pain allow us to gain something. But God doesn't do that. He doesn't give any clear explanation of why there is suffering. But he

does chip away at an oversimplified notion that prevailed at the time of Job and even at the time of Jesus: God loves those who do the right thing and he hurts those who do the wrong thing. People are always called to do the things of God to obtain what they want. That's not the basis of the relationship we should have with God. Are we in this relationship for what we can get, the pleasure we derive from it? Well, yes — partly. But it can't simply be only that. It has to be more. What we see in this story is the wonderful way in which Job works with this situation to ultimately recognize that whatever happens, he is connected to God and God is connected to him.

The challenge is to enter into a relationship that isn't based on anything except that we have chosen the relationship. It is something we want. We know that a relationship with God brings us enormous blessings. But it's not based on these blessings. Think of any relationship you have with someone you love. Think of the wonderful experience of finding someone who seems not so separate from you, and you feel comfortable in their presence. You really want to be with them. Even though they do wonderful things for you, the reason you are in the relationship is not because of the wonderful things but because of who you are and the way you feel when you are with them. We want connection. We want intimacy. We are made for this intimacy with God. Our challenge is to be in love with God on this level — not on the level for what we can get, but simply on the level of: This is where I want to be. St. Paul had a distant relationship with God. He was under the command to do what he felt God was calling him to do. He wasn't at all in touch with the beautiful, powerful message of Jesus about a God who lived inside of him. At one point in his life, God entered into his head and into his heart and blew him apart in the sense that he showed Paul something he had never seen before. Paul had done nothing to deserve this insight, and he was always aware of the gift. God entered into Paul's life and gave him something. When Paul received this gift from God, he had the compulsion to preach and teach it. I love that part of human nature. When you have something good, powerful, and wonderful, you can't keep it a secret. You have to give it to the people you love.

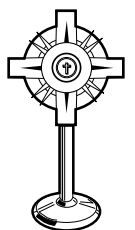

As we have mentioned in recent weeks, it is of extreme importance to this campaign to have the full and active participation of each of us as members of Holy Family. As we continue our campaign to raise the necessary funds for the renovation of our worship space, we are also looking at ways to keep the expenses of this campaign as small as possible. To ensure that every possible dollar goes to the actual renovation Fr. Enrique, in consultation with several leaders of our parish including the Finance Council, made the decision not to hire a company to manage the campaign, thus saving us thousands of dollars.

It was also decided that we would not mail out envelope sets. Instead, we will have Legacy Campaign tables set up at the exits of the church each Sunday. There will be volunteers at each table to

- answer your questions,
- help you set up your pledge and
- Since we will not be mailing out envelope sets for Legacy pledges, you will find envelopes for your pledge payments at these tables.
 - The envelopes for the pledge payments will have a place for your envelope number, if you have one, your name and the amount of your donation. We will also need you to check a box, indicating that this is a pledge payment
- If you are receiving the weekly envelope sets, please use those Legacy envelopes and write “Pledge” on them along with the amount of your pledge.
 - If you have been using these envelopes to donate to the Legacy Fund, we would ask two things of you:
 - o Please be sure to fill out a pledge card. By doing so you will help us as we try to calculate how much will be contributed over the next 48 months. It will also allow us to give a more accurate projection of pledges in our report to the bishop and the diocesan finance council.
 - o Please prayerfully consider increasing your contribution. It has taken us over ten years to accumulate almost \$500,000 in our Legacy Fund. If we are going to raise the needed funds for the renovation of our church, then each of our contributions will need to increase significantly and substantially.

Your generous financial support of this effort to improve and renovate our church will make it possible to:

- Replace the roof.
- Slope the floor in order to lower the altar by 3 steps. The altar will remain the center and focal point of the assembly
- Remove the wall behind the sanctuary.
- Moved the altar about 12-15 feet back from its present location,.
- To plaster the wall behind the sanctuary and have a fresco of the Holy Family centered, horizontally, over the tabernacle, which will be located on the back wall.
- The actual area of the sanctuary will be reduced allowing us to increase the space between the pews.
- The width of the aisles across the back of the church will be increased to allow for increased wheelchair access.
- At least one of the confessionals will be wheelchair accessible.
- The bathrooms at the front of the church will be enlarged to accommodate more than one person at a time.
- Lighting will be upgraded to LED.
- To maximize the amount of natural light that comes into the church, the existing colored windows will be replaced with etched art glass (clear) depicting various scripture stories of the Holy Family.
- To provide easier access for wheelchairs and for funeral services, we will build a plaza at the front of the church which will include an adequate ramp for ease of access for everyone who has mobility concerns.

This list is a broad overview of what we hope to accomplish, and we expect it to change as we continue to refine the scope of the project.

As our Legacy Campaign moves forward, of the 2,500 registered families, we have about 250 families who have committed pledges totaling more than \$560,000, which will be paid in a period of 4 years. Of that total, as of January 31, 2018, \$34,250 has already been contributed. It continues to be a fair start, but we still have a very long way to go and we need more families to commit to a substantial pledge.

We are extremely grateful for those families who have already pledged \$5,000 or more over the next 4 years. We are also very grateful for those families who have made their initial down payment and the first installment on their pledge. Thank you for your generosity.

For those who have not made a pledge, we encourage you to continue to prayerfully discern your support for our parish. After all, it is the responsibility of all of us, as Catholic Christians, to maintain and, on occasion, renovate the house of God, that is our worship environment.

For those who have already made a substantial commitment, we are sincerely grateful for your sacrifice and your support.

To everyone, it is with sincere gratitude, we thank you for your kindness, your patience, your understanding, and most importantly, thank you for your great generosity, your support and your prayers.

- Aumentar el espacio entre las bancas al reducir el área del Santuario.
- Aumentar el ancho de los pasillos en la parte posterior de la iglesia para permitir el acceso a sillas de ruedas.
- Hacer accesible para sillas de ruedas al menos uno de los confesionarios.
- Los baños en la parte delantera de la iglesia serán agrandados para acomodar a más de una persona a la vez.
- La iluminación se actualizará a LED.
- Para maximizar la cantidad de luz natural que entra en la iglesia, las ventanas existentes serán substituidas por el vidrio de arte grabado (claro) que representa varias historias de las escrituras de la Sagrada Familia.
- Para facilitar el acceso a sillas de ruedas y servicios funerarios, construiremos una plaza en la parte delantera de la iglesia que incluirá una rampa adecuada para facilitar el acceso a todos los que tengan problemas de movilidad.

Esta lista es una amplia visión general de lo que esperamos lograr, y anticipamos que cambie a medida que continuamos refinando el alcance del proyecto.

A medida que nuestra campaña de legado avanza, de las 2.500 familias registradas, tenemos alrededor de 250 familias que han comprometido a donar un total de más de \$560.000, que pagarán en un período de 4 años. De ese total, al 31 de enero de 2018, \$34.250 ya han sido entregados a la parroquia. Sigue siendo un comienzo justo, pero todavía nos queda un largo camino por recorrer y necesitamos que más familias se comprometan con una promesa sustancial.

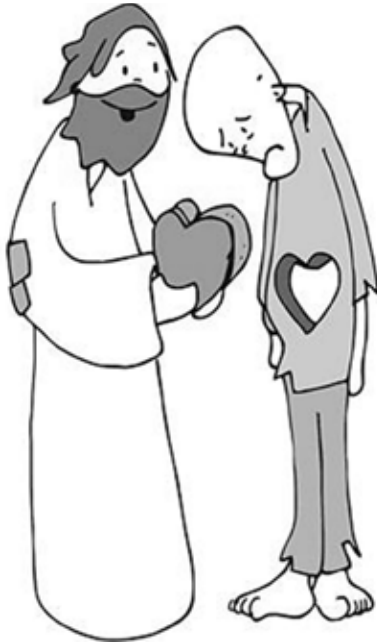

REFLEXIÓN SOBRE EL MENSAJE DE HOY



El primer episodio que nos cuenta el evangelio nos muestra a Jesús entrando en una casa privada, en la casa de la suegra de Pedro. En él podemos contemplar el Reino de Dios, que viene a nuestra humanidad para reconfigurarla también allí donde entran en juego los afectos, las relaciones de proximidad y las adhesiones profundas. El Reino es la venida a nosotros de un Dios que quiere llevar a cabo un intercambio íntimo con cada uno, estableciendo una relación de proximidad, de comunión. Los gestos realizados por Jesús se caracterizan precisamente por este rasgo de la proximidad; así se explica su visita a la suegra de Pedro, que está enferma; el hecho de escuchar a quienes le hablan de ella, el cogerla por la mano y levantarla.

Se nota en él un amor que se aproxima a nosotros en el momento del dolor, que nos coge por la mano, infundiéndonos una renovada seguridad; se advierte sobre todo una proximidad que reanima. Se realiza aquí, de modo sumo, esa caridad que la Palabra de Dios nos pide que hagamos nuestra, proponiéndonos asimismo el ejemplo de Pablo y sus demandas a los cristianos «maduros» de Corinto. Nuestra verdadera madurez en la fe se muestra en la acogida del camino de la caridad, esa caridad que Dios ha usado en Cristo con nosotros, respondiendo a nuestro grito como a Job, porque nuestra vida es como un soplo (Job 7,7).

Con todo, el rasgo de la proximidad no debe hacernos perder el sentido del misterio ni la conciencia de que Dios, aunque se aproxima a nosotros, no puede ser manipulado por nuestros deseos ni circunscrito a nuestros conocimientos y a nuestras vivencias. Nos ilumina el ejemplo de Jesús, que «salió» hacia el desierto para orar cuando aún era de noche. Jesús no sucumbe a la tentación del éxito y de la notoriedad como nosotros, a

riesgo de ser devorado por quien reclama una «proximidad» que se convierte en pretensión de poseer a Dios y domesticarlo. Jesús, por el contrario, «salió» para retirarse a orar; no se pone en el centro a sí mismo, sino al Padre. Jesús realiza verdaderamente su propio «éxodo» desde las expectativas de la gente, aceptando, en cambio, la difícil voluntad del Padre. Nuestra plegaria debe ser, por eso, una búsqueda de la voluntad de Dios a ejemplo y con la ayuda de Jesús.

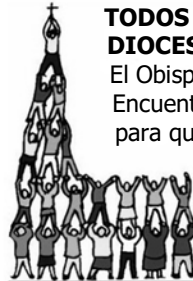
