BREAKING OPEN THE WORD – 25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

READINGS: WISDOM 2:12, 17-20 · PSALM 54:3-8 · JAMES 3:16 – 4:3 · MARK 9:30-37

OVERVIEW:

One of the earliest Christian texts called the “Didache,” or the Teachings of the Twelve Apostles (“didache” means “teachings”), begins with a clear contrast between “two ways” – the way of life and the way of death. And there is a “great difference between the two ways.” This week’s readings also present a clear contrast between good and evil and show how goodness is vilified by those who don’t believe in God. The first reading shows the difference between the righteous and the wicked. The “just one,” who prefigures Christ, is reviled by ungodly men who test his faith by subjecting him to cruelty and torture. They hate him because his goodness, purity and faith shines a spotlight on their wickedness, which can only thrive in the darkness of ignorance. From earliest times the Church has interpreted this passage in light of Christ’s suffering and death. It was chosen for its obvious connection to this week’s gospel where Jesus predicts his passion for a second time. The second reading also contrasts good and evil. It describes the virtues of the righteous person who is first of all ‘pure and peaceable.’ The righteous person experiences a deep, inner peace that comes from a clear conscience; a peace that bears fruit in the world. By contrast, the unrighteous person is full of “jealousy and selfish ambition,” the fruit of which is “disorder and every foul practice.” This week’s gospel has two parts. In the first part we hear Christ’s second prediction of his passion (the first one occurred after Peter’s profession of faith in last week’s gospel). The second part contains Christ’s teachings about true leadership and greatness. The one who is called to lead, Jesus says, must be willing to serve and give his life for the sake of others. A truly great leader identifies with the pure and innocent ones of this world, represented by the little child whom he puts front and center. Putting his arms around him, Jesus shows his disciples how they must renounce worldly power and ambition, and embrace innocence and humility.

“Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us.” (Wisdom 2:12)

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH: “Before Christ’s second coming, the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers. The persecution that accompanies her pilgrimage on earth will unveil the ‘mystery of iniquity’ in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth.” [no. 675]

POPE FRANCIS: “In the face of Satan’s work the angels defend us: they defend man and they defend the God-man, the superior man, Jesus Christ, who is the perfection of humanity, the most perfect one. He is exactly who they [the demons] want to destroy; and when they cannot destroy Jesus the person, they seek to destroy his people; and when they cannot destroy the People of God, they make up humanistic explanations that actually go against man, against humanity and against God. This is why the battle is a daily reality in Christian life, in our family, in our people, in our Churches”. [Daily Meditations, 09.29.14]

LIFE APPLICATION: St. Augustine said that evil is nothing in itself, but rather a corruption of the good. Evil is, in a sense, parasitic. It ‘feeds’ on goodness the way a parasite feeds on its host, ultimately killing it. Goodness, like the host, must of necessity tolerate evil, but evil cannot tolerate goodness. It must devour it until every last trace of it gone. That is why, as this week’s first reading shows especially, wicked men cannot even bear the sight of the righteous one; he is “obnoxious” and so must be eliminated. Why? Because the very existence of goodness is a judgment against evil, and that cannot be tolerated. Goodness, in other words, is tolerant. Evil is not. This week’s readings remind us that belief in God, fidelity to the Church, goodness, decency and moral rectitude are rarely rewarded. In this fallen world of ours vice is celebrated and virtue mocked more often than not. Jesus said “blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven” (Matthew 5:12). The righteous person, however, doesn’t follow the herd, worry about what other people think or try to fit in. There is no “fitting in” with evil. The good person understands the difference between the “two ways”, follows the path of life, trusts in God and stands firm in the faith for in the end he knows his reward is in heaven.

LIVING THE GOSPEL OF LIFE

Dear Secretary Azar,

We were shocked and dismayed at the news report that the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has signed a contract to purchase "fresh" aborted fetal organs from Advanced Bioscience Resources, for the purpose of creating humanized mice with human immune systems. We expect far better of our federal agencies – especially under the leadership of a courageous pro-life president – entrusted with the health of American citizens. It is completely unacceptable to discover that the FDA is using federal tax dollars and fomenting demand for human body parts taken from babies who are aborted.

The FDA's statement to the news reporter who uncovered this government-sponsored trafficking in baby body parts said that the FDA is "committed to ensuring that its research is conducted responsibly, conforms with all legal requirements, and meets the highest ethical standards."

These experiments using aborted fetal organs are neither responsible nor do they meet even modest ethical standards, and there are serious questions about the legality of methods used to procure the aborted baby organs and tissue.

REFLEXIÓN SOBRE EL MENSAJE DE HOY

La «sabiduría» absolutamente terrena alaba el éxito personal y lo persigue a toda costa.
