BEING AN INSTRUMENT OF LIFE AND LOVE

God is the one who has created us. He has made us, and he knows us. He knows us better than we know ourselves. God longs to reveal a plan to us, and the plan, when we open our hearts and minds and truly listen, is a plan that will bring us fullness. We can say that the plan of God is the best possibility we have for a full life. If we embrace the way in which God invites us to live, we will find wholeness, or holiness, in our lives. Now we have often misunderstood the Scriptures, and we have laid a burden upon people where they feel they have to do certain things or not do certain other things. The readings today can be misinterpreted if we don't delve into them deeply or understand the context in which the words were spoken. We're very likely to come up with a misunderstanding of the way of God if we don't interpret the words correctly. I've gotten caught up in a particular misunderstanding often in my life, and you may have experienced this as well. It goes like this: If you and I are having a good time, if life is good and we are enjoying what we have and we experience abundance, then you and I feel we are in trouble— just from the simple fact that things are good, rich, and full. But if we are miserable, if we have a lousy situation or we are in pain, then somehow we mistakenly perceive that's a better place to be. Somehow, that place of suffering is where we think God wants us to be. The theory goes like this: God is hard on those who are comfortable, and easy on those who are miserable. If we are happy and full in this life, we will be miserable later. If we are miserable here, we will be happy later. What an awful image!

If God is love, and if he has created us to live in love, then why in heaven's name would he ever set up a system bent on putting us in a place of misery? God is not interested in us being miserable. God is not interested in us being in pain as a way of life. God is concerned about something, though. God is terribly concerned about one key issue: He wants so much for you and me to be instruments of life. That's the goal. Jesus says that his gospel is all about love. We find that the fullness of the teaching of Jesus reveals how we must be connected to our brothers and sisters. We have to be sources of life. We have to be people that the Spirit uses to bring good things to others. We cannot talk about a God who is calling us into relationship with him and, at the same time, forget about our brothers and sisters. Throughout the Old Testament, we see God's longing for people to be connected to each other. The connections with each other were an integral part of

their relationship with God. When we listen to the book of Amos the prophet, we hear him often complaining about the people's hypocrisy. We need to recognize that Amos was speaking to a group of very religious people. They were very fixed on the temple and fulfilling the law. They wanted to do the right thing. They wanted to please God. Somehow, they didn't get the part about being connected to their brothers and sisters. If someone was in pain, they didn't see the need to bother about them. They felt that if they were fulfilling all of the laws of the temple, that was all they needed to do. Amos is especially concerned about the people who were leaders — the priests, the upper class. They were the ones who should have been giving the example, and yet, they were most prone to disconnecting themselves from people in need. They didn't sense the people's need.

We need people in our communities who possess positive energy. We know the experience of being around someone who makes us feel full. There are other people in our life who are like drains, sucking away at our life. We leave certain situations and feel exhausted. These people are not in a disposition of really caring and listening. Granted, the flow goes both ways; we have to be sources of energy for people we encounter as well. Awareness and connection are key themes in living a full life. Being an instrument of life and love to one another is our challenge. We need to open ourselves up to this challenge. We don't want to fall into the trap of being "rich," autonomous and separate, uncaring, so filled with our own needs that we don't pay attention to other people's needs. We want to be in the disposition of true spiritual poverty where we are willing to give to others in their need. That process usually begins with knowing our own needs. When we feel that longing inside of us for the things we don't have, we know that makes us ready and sensitive for those who need a positive touch, a listening ear, or a way of just being there for them.

Jesus was a man for other people; he longed to serve. If we truly are Jesus' followers, we want to be like him. We want to be able to walk into a room with the sensitivity that there may be someone in that room we can really touch. We want to possess a positive energy that comes from a God who is more generous and loving than we could ever imagine.

SCAM Warning

It's been over 18 months since we received a message from the diocese about email-based attempts to lure parishioners into buying gift cards for fraudulent purposes. Unfortunately, this scam has appeared again in the Sacramento Diocese.

An individual established an email address resembling one used by a parish priest and falsely represented themselves as that priest in email conversations with a parishioner. In these emails, as in previous incidents, the bad actor asked the parishioner to buy gift cards to benefit others. The scammer engaged in very convincing dialogue with the victim, making that person believe the requestor was the parish priest. Again, like previous scams of this nature, the suspect may have obtained the victim's email address and name from a church bulletin or website.

Please remember that pastors or other clergy members will not typically solicit donations via emails or texts.

Any parishioner who receives a request like this should verify its authenticity personally with the purported sender before making any contribution. If a parishioner believes they have been victimized, they should report the incident to local law enforcement and to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (<https://www.ic3.gov/>).

REFLEXIÓN SOBRE EL MENSAJE DE HOY

La parábola del hombre rico y de Lázaro es de una notable sencillez: Dios nos sitúa ante el juicio que emite sobre cada uno de nosotros y ante la conversión que se nos pide. El rico epulón descubre, por desgracia demasiado tarde, quién es verdaderamente el Señor. Llegado aquí, no tiene otro remedio que pedirle que Lázaro vaya a advertir a sus hermanos para que cambien de vida y no tengan que caer en el lugar de tormento en el que él se encuentra. Pero Abrahán le responde: «Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, tampoco harán caso aunque resucite un muerto» (Lc 16,31).



El problema que nos presenta el evangelio es, precisamente, el de comprender que la conversión requiere la escucha de la Palabra de Dios. Para convertirnos es absolutamente necesario que escuchemos con atención la Palabra de Dios. Es preciso que permitamos a la Palabra bajar a nuestro corazón. Ahora bien, para que podamos recibirla de manera fructuosa, es menester abrirle nuestro corazón, a fin de permitirle penetrar hasta el fondo. La conversión es siempre un problema de corazón, o sea, un problema de interioridad, de abandono fundamental de todo, con la intención de dejar que Dios disponga de toda nuestra vida. Podemos decir también que la conversión significa aflojar los dedos, aferrados a algo de una manera espasmódica, para caer por completo en las manos de Dios (Mt 6,25ss), o sea, para depender únicamente de él.

El verdadero pobre, cuando es tal, está totalmente suspendido del amor de Dios. Se muestra en todo libre y disponible a su amor. El rico, en cambio, se endurece cada vez más en este mundo. Justamente por eso no le resulta fácil comprender a los pobres, porque no capta el valor de la vida humana y, por consiguiente, tampoco el de la conversión. El testimonio que debemos dar de nuestra fe es, precisamente, la conversión, que compromete de una manera incondicionada toda la existencia como un todo, incluida una confianza total en la gracia de Dios. Ahora bien, ese testimonio exige una larga lucha. Significa confiarse sin vacilaciones a Dios, que nos ha escogido desde la eternidad. No es nunca conquista nuestra, sino un deber de amor al que sólo se puede responder con amor. No se va al cielo «tumbado en cómodos divanes».

El rico epulón no fue condenado simplemente por su riqueza, sino porque no fue capaz de ofrecer su ayuda al pobre, que carecía de todo y, enfermo, se estaba muriendo al lado de su puerta. El pecado es la riqueza que permite que los pobres mueran junto a su propia puerta; es la falta de solidaridad que separa a los hombres.

PREGUNTA DE LA SEMANA

Pregunta para los niños: Jesús nos enseña a compartir lo que tenemos con los demás. ¿Qué tienen ustedes que pueden compartir?

Pregunta para los jóvenes: La historia del Evangelio nos dice que seremos juzgados por lo que hacemos o no hacemos por el pobre y el necesitado. Como persona joven, tú sabes ¡qué difícil es conseguir dinero! Entonces, con la cantidad de dinero que tengas, ¿cómo te aseguras de compartir al menos un poco con los demás?

Pregunta para los adultos: ¿Qué opciones pueden tomar o han tomado para equilibrar su propia vida con aquéllos que no tienen hogar, con los pobres y con los que necesitan ayuda en su vida diaria? ¿Cómo les informa el Evangelio acerca de esto?

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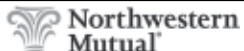
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
