## CELEBRATING THREE SPECIAL EVENTS

### **PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY**

Today, Catholic parishes throughout the United States are showing support for their priests with prayer, celebration and dialogue. The last Sunday of October is designated as Priesthood Sunday, a special day to honor Priesthood in the United States. It is a call for parishioners to honor Christ as Priest and those who were called to be his priests on earth. It is also a day to honor all religious and to focus on the importance of vocations.

*"The purpose of Priesthood Sunday is to engage every level of the church in the United States in a national conversation about the priesthood," said Rev. Richard Vega, President of the National Federation of Priests' Councils which represents more than 26,000 U.S. priests.*

Priesthood Sunday was established in 2003 to provide a way for Catholic communities to express appreciation for the devoted priests who serve them so faithfully despite recent negative attention in the media. Such a celebration is increasingly relevant in light of the declining number of priests in the U.S.

We celebrate and honor our priests who have given their lives in answer to God's call and in acceptance of his challenge: The Call is beautifully described within the words of the Preface Eucharistic Prayer in the Liturgy of the Chrism Mass:

*"He calls them to lead your holy people in love, nourish them by your word and strengthen them through the sacraments. Father, they are to give their lives in your service and for the salvation of your people as they strive to grow in the likeness of Christ and honor you by their courageous witness of faith and love."*

The Challenge was beautifully described in the words of the beloved Pope John Paul II:

Do not be afraid to go out on the streets and into public places, like the first Apostles who preached Christ and the Good News of salvation in the squares of cities, towns and villages. This is no time to be ashamed of the Gospel (cf. Rom 1:16). It is the time to preach it from the rooftops (cf. Mt 10:27). Do not be afraid to break out of comfortable and routine modes of living, in order to take up the challenge of making Christ known in the modern "metropolis." It is you who must "go out into the byroads" (Mt 22:9) and invite everyone you meet to the banquet which God has prepared for his people. The Gospel must not be kept hidden because of fear or indifference. It was never meant to be hidden

away in private. It has to be put on a stand so that people may see its light and give praise to our heavenly Father (cf. Mt 5:15-16).

### **ALL SAINTS DAY - TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 1**

We celebrate a solemnity this Friday—the feast of All Saints. It is, in a sense, a feast day for each one of us. Every one of us is considered to be a saint. We are called to be saints by our baptism, by a deep inner longing within each of us that longs to accomplish the destiny God has given us.

One of the things we can glean from the feast of All Saints is a clearer understanding of what a saint really is. If we go back to the early Church, we find that the word "saint" was synonymous with the word "martyr," someone who gave his or her life for the Church. As time went on, the word "saint" encompassed all those who were under the guidance of the Spirit, and revealed that this Spirit had major impact on their lives. They manifested goodness, and they effected change in others. In some cases, they performed miracles.

We have a system in the Church that recognizes saints by canonizing them; these are the famous ones. It's certainly easy to understand that most of us will not be in the category of famous, canonized saints. But that doesn't mean we aren't part of this great company of saints.

### **ALL SOULS DAY - WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 2**

We can relate All Souls whom we commemorate to the "little ones" in the day's gospel reading. Jesus thanks God for revealing to "little ones" the things hidden from the wise and learned of this world. God the Father has given Jesus, the Son, total and absolute authority to reveal the Father to whomever he wishes. It is our hope that the souls who have preceded us in death are now among the "little ones" to whom Jesus has revealed the Father in heaven.

All Souls whom we remember on this special day are those who labored and were burdened during their lives on earth. They took the "yoke" of Jesus' new teachings--avoid anger and revenge, be honest and truthful, love even enemies, etc.--upon themselves. By suffering death they have learned from the meekness and humility of Jesus, who laid down his life for us in humble and selfless service. It is to these "All Souls" who have died and to all of us who will one day follow them that Jesus promises rest in the eternal life of heaven. That Jesus has died to win for all of us this eternal rest makes it easier for us to accept the deaths of All Souls who now enjoy that eternal rest that we look forward to with confident hope.

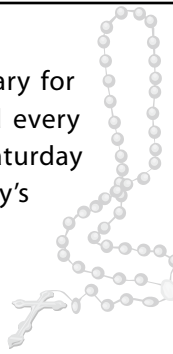

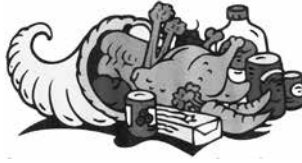

## **REFLECTION**

## **SCAM Warning**

It's been over 18 months since we received a message from the diocese about email-based attempts to lure parishioners into buying gift cards for fraudulent purposes. Unfortunately, this scam has appeared again in the Sacramento Diocese.

An individual established an email address resembling one used by a parish priest and falsely represented themselves as that priest in email conversations with a parishioner. In these emails, as in previous incidents, the bad actor asked the parishioner to buy gift cards to benefit others. The scammer engaged in very convincing dialogue with the victim, making that person believe the requestor was the parish priest. Again, like previous scams of this nature, the suspect may have obtained the victim's email address and name from a church bulletin or website.

Please remember that pastors or other clergy members will not typically solicit donations via emails or texts.

Any parishioner who receives a request like this should verify its authenticity personally with the purported sender before making any contribution. If a parishioner believes they have been victimized, they should report the incident to local law enforcement and to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (<https://www.ic3.gov/>).

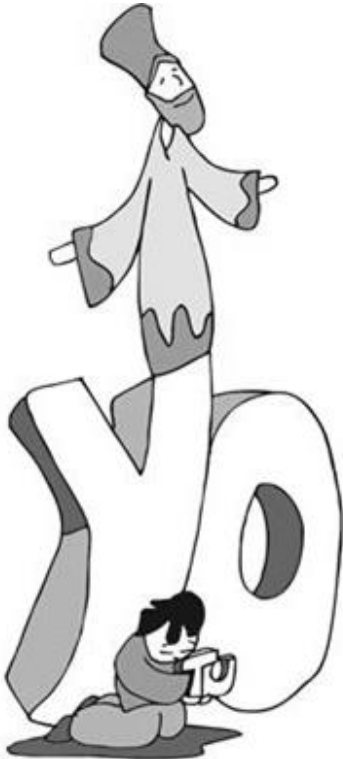

### REFLEXIÓN SOBRE EL MENSAJE DE HOY



Nos sentimos siempre un tanto incómodos ante el pasaje evangélico del fariseo y del publicano. Nos desagrada un poco que haya sólo dos protagonistas. Nosotros, en efecto, no nos sentimos identificados con el fariseo, tan antipático en su actitud de persona de bien que mira a todos los otros de arriba abajo –incluso a Dios, si fuera posible–; sin embargo, tampoco nos identificamos con el publicano, porque es difícil reconocerse tan odiosamente pecadores, aunque al final quisiéramos ser «justificados» como él.

A decir verdad, hay un tercer personaje, presente en el relato, aunque invisible: somos nosotros. Soy yo, el que ahora lee la parábola. En mi corazón no está ni sólo el fariseo ni sólo el publicano, sino sucesivamente uno y otro, o bien ambos al mismo tiempo. Está el deseo de ser una persona agradable a Dios, una persona que de vez en cuando se cree superior a los otros; vienen, a continuación, momentos en los que, por gracia, se me concede advertir qué lejos ando de los sentimientos de Cristo, y, entonces, ya ni siquiera me atrevo a levantar los ojos al cielo. La vida cristiana es, por tanto –como dice san Pablo–, una lucha, un combate, una carrera para conseguir, con una imploración incesante, llegar a ser dóciles y humildes, llegar a tener en nosotros «los mismos sentimientos de Cristo Jesús», el cual no vino a aplastarnos con su superioridad, sino a hacerse pobre, pequeño, incluso pecado y maldito, para que nosotros pudiéramos ser justificados.

### PREGUNTA DE LA SEMANA

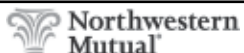
